I know you deal with a lot of cases, but I hope you remember the hearing June 5th 2010. The courtroom was packed with friends and family that Scott touched in some way. I also hope you remember how there was no remorse from Trisha Schneider, ~~to~~ her family or friends.

I try to keep putting one foot in front of the other each day, I do that because my love for Scott is so strong and he wants me to. One of the Iowa State Patrol officers contacted me to let me know that Mr Wegman did not feel it was necessary to ~~com~~ do anything about the ones who assisted Trisha that night.

What they all did was wrong - helping to try and cover things up - leaving me alone on that gravel road to find my husband and dog - the cockiness they all displayed before the arrest and sentencing.

90 days is like the slap on the wrist a child would receive for breaking curfew.

What does that tell Trisha and her friends:
 "Hey - you take a life and get 90 days!"

She did not get transferred to the correctional facility until July 13th.

I know that nothing will take the pain or memory away of what happened Nov. 8th.

But Trisha Schneider and her friends need to know and understand that they need to be accountable for their actions and poor decisions.

I do not understand why Mr. Wegman will not at least make the others do community service or something to ~~to~~ let them know that they too had something to do with the leaving the scene.

The youth are our future. They need to be held accountable.

Please contact me if you can and let me know you received this and if you are able to share with me what might happen concerning Trisha Schneider.

Dear Sir:

I am the mother of Scott R. Henry who was hit and killed on the road near his home in Fredericksburg, IA. by an auto driven by Trisha Schneider on November 8, 2011.

Trisha Schneider was an unlicensed driver, driving a borrowed car. After hitting Scott and his dog and driving into the ditch, she neglected to call "911" for help - but instead called several friends who assisted her in removing the car from the ditch and leave the scene of the accident.

Trisha Schneider was originally charged with three (3) felonies which could have resulted, I believe, in a 20-year sentences.

Two of the felony charges were erased when she changed her plea to "guilty." This then left her sentence to ten (10) years in prison for her reckless and out of control driving that so needlessly took the life of Scott and his dog.

I sincerely trust, if and when, you review and reconsider her case, you will hold firm in your decision of the 10-year sentence, with no reduction, which is truly a minimal sentence for taking an innocent victim's life.
